What is Wet Foot?

Wet Foot is designed to give All Souls partners the opportunity to learn and to serve God in a cross-cultural setting.

Activities can involve working on a single project or helping in a variety of different areas. You may be doing building work, children's work, teaching or carrying out evangelism, all alongside local Christians, in a cross-cultural setting. Projects typically last between 2 weeks and 6 months.

What can Wet Foot give me?

How can I get involved?

1) Through an All Souls Team

Each summer teams are organised to take part in short term cross-cultural projects. Most people who join these teams do so using their annual leave or during a holiday from their studies.

Some of our recent teams have:

- helped renovate an orphanage and studied with theological students in Kenya
- assisted with building houses for people affected by leprosy in Ethiopia
- used sports as a platform to share the gospel in Peru
- done beach evangelism in Tenerife

2) As an individual

All Souls is happy to support church partners going out with one of these organisations so please contact the Wet Foot committee if you are considering a trip as an individual. Recent Wet Footers taking this option have visited countries such as Japan, Brazil, Uganda and Nicaragua.

What all Wet Footers receive

- a link person to provide advice and discuss the relevant project
- prayer support
- an invitation to the All Souls Wet Foot training programs

The All Souls teams will also have a training and preparation weekend prior to their departure.
