Job Summary:

- As technology specialist on staff oversee the front-of-house and behind-the-scenes technical infrastructure and systems and provide tailored and appropriate technical solutions to enable effective ministry.
- Work alongside Church staff and serving partners to understand the technical needs of the organisation and keep abreast of latest developments in technology to assist in this respect.
- Train church staff and serving partners to enable them to make full use of the provided technical solutions.
- Monitor the appropriateness of infrastructure systems and cloud services to ensure their integrity and security in terms of regular maintenance / updating / documentation etc.
- Represent the technical team in the events planning process and assist in the running of events where required.

Details of role:

Under the management of the Creative producer and working with the Volunteer Technology Director:

- Hold day-to-day responsibility for the provision and operation of technology, both front-of-house in the Church and behind-the-scenes in the offices and supporting functions

- Provide technology solutions to the Church, making use of external expertise where necessary
- Co-ordinate the technical systems infrastructure and contribute to its design, to include AV and broadcast systems, PA systems and theatre lighting, desktop computers, internet connections, websites, databases and cloud services; across All Souls, St Pauls, Langham Arts, ASLAN and All Souls' home-workers
- Hold day to day responsibility for the integrity of operational systems, including accurate record-keeping of configuration and inventory, and tidy management of spares-holdings
- Responsible for providing first-line technical support to staff. This includes calling upon supplier or volunteer-provided second and third-line technology support when needed
- Responsible for implementing and enforcing IT security across the entire All Souls estate
- Responsible for equipment maintenance, including proactively recommending retirement/replacement of old technology
- Develop and deliver training programmes to staff and serving partners to ensure that best use is made of technology solutions provided
- Assist in ensuring the ongoing suitability of technical systems, proactively recommending changes and new technologies where necessary
- Contribute to the annual development of the technology budget, and accurately manage day to day expenditure within the budget
- Contribute to the All Souls' technical strategy, developed in response to the Church's aims and needs and by observation of external industry trends
- Meet with the Volunteer Technology Director one evening per week or more if necessary to discuss technology operations, new requirements, budget and planning
- Serving Partner tech team engineering support: will also include some operation on Sundays on the tech team rota, and evenings when serving partner support not available, booked as time-off-in-lieu that is taken at another time.

It is desired but not essential that you attend All Souls as a congregation member. Part of the interview would be a discussion about the feasibility of this.

There is an occupational requirement that the job-holder is a Christian under Part 1 of Schedule 9 to the Equality Act 2010.

We are aware that those from ethnic minority groups (BAME) are currently under-represented on our staff team so we particularly encourage applications from these groups. Appointment will of course be based on merit alone.
